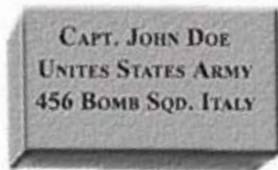
at Lincoln’s Veteran’s Memorial Garden

A “Brick of Remembrance” is available to all Veterans, living or deceased, who are serving honorably or have received an Honorable or General discharge. The bricks are displayed in the Veteran’s Memorial Garden in Antelope Park, Lincoln, NE. Bricks will be placed on a wall next to the Memorial that you designate. Bricks for Veterans organizations and Auxiliary organizations will be accepted and placed in the Family section. The proceeds from brick sales go to improvements and maintenance of the Veteran’s Memorial Garden.

Once placed in the Garden, all bricks become property of the City of Lincoln and the City reserves the right to verify the information. Only one name per form will be accepted. An annual dedication of newly placed bricks is held on the second Saturday in June at 10:00 a.m. Bricks may not be in place for the dedication if this form is received after March 31st of that year.
